Lost and Found

Missouri Capitol Police maintains a lost and found at our office in the Truman Building, located in room 101. If you have misplaced an item, please contact our office to see if it has been turned in. Jewelry, keys, glasses, cell phones and clothing are turned in almost daily. To check if an item has been turned in, call (573) 751-2541 anytime, or stop by the communications window next to the first floor escalator between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Disabled Parking Law

[Missouri Revised Statute 304.079](#) states that designated disabled parking spaces are only to be used by a disabled person who has been issued a disabled license plate or windshield hanging placard. The person who is issued the disabled license plate or windshield hanging placard must be an occupant of the motor vehicle either immediately prior to parking or while the vehicle is being parked. The driver or any occupant of a motor vehicle parked in a designated disabled parking space must be prepared to provide law enforcement with the disabled registration certificate or other authorization upon request. Failure to prove that the driver or occupant is lawfully entitled to use the disabled parking space can result in the driver being charged with a Class A misdemeanor.

CALEA is an international accrediting agency that aims to improve law enforcement service delivery, professionalism, and strengthen accountability. Workplace Safety, Security and Crime Prevention



State employees play an important role in workplace safety, security and crime prevention. You can help reduce the likelihood of crime and violence in your workplace by remembering to:

- Use your ID badge or access code when accessing secure buildings or areas and do not allow others you don't know to come in behind you.
- Secure valuables when leaving your work area for a prolonged period and, at the end of the day, secure all doors, windows, cabinets and drawers.
- Report thefts, threats, property damage or suspicious activity immediately.
- If you ever fear someone may try to cause physical harm to you at work, report the situation to your supervisor and/or law enforcement as soon as possible. If you find yourself in this situation, it may be appropriate for you to file for a protection order.
